The Committee have agreed not to approach sponsors during the pandemic but hope to start again in 2023.

Show Rules

1. All exhibitors over the age of 16 must be members of the Club.
2. The Show Membership Subscription shall be £3.00 per show (children free)
3. The entrance for all classes is **Free**
4. All exhibitors must specify on the entry form the various classes in which they intend to compete. **Staging times shall be 6:00pm to 9:00pm Friday and 7:30am to 9:45am Saturday.**
5. **Entries will be accepted up to 9.30am on the day of the show (with the exception of honey entries, which are required 1 week in advance) with all exhibits staged and the hall cleared by 9:45am. Articles may not be removed until the end of the show**
6. Each article intended for competition, must include a label, which will be supplied by the Club, with the exhibitors name and address.
7. All plants, flowers, fruits, vegetables etc., entered for competition, must be the property of and grown by the competitor and have been in their possession for at least 6 weeks previous to the show, except Floral Art, and must be free from pest and disease. Exhibits must be entered in the name of the owner of the garden from which the exhibit came. Exception to this rule: if members of a family wish to share the credit for an exhibit then they can enter in joint names.
8. No competitor is allowed to stage more than one exhibit in any class with articles of the same denomination, except in the Chrysanthemum classes.
9. No article will be shown more than once at this show in the Handicrafts Section.
10. Only exhibitors and their assistants will be allowed to enter the Show area during staging.
11. The Committee reserves the right to visit the gardens of all competitors within 2 weeks before or after the Show. Refusal to allow access will disqualify the competitor.
12. The judge's decision shall be final. No protest will be considered unless violation of the rule can be proved. Protests may be lodged with the Secretary within two hours of the Show opening on payment of £1.00, which will be refunded if the protest is upheld.
13. The Club will not be responsible for the loss of, or damage done to plants, flowers, fruits, vegetables, stands, or other articles while in the exhibition but all ordinary care will be taken of them.
14. Prize money shall be paid out in full on the day of the show. In the event of funds of the Club not being sufficient (after meeting all liabilities) to pay prizes in full, the funds available will be divided among the prize-winners in proportion to the amount of their prizes. Prize money and trophies will be withheld until infringements of rules 7 and/or 11 are resolved.
15. A child winning a trophy in the same age group three times in succession will be awarded a miniature trophy in addition to the prize money.
16. Cup or Trophy winners will be responsible for their safekeeping and must return them in good, clean condition, to the Secretary by 9.00am on the day of the Show.
17. Cut flowers will be shown in vases supplied by the Club.
18. **Confined classes are open to residents in or within a 4 mile radius of Leuchars.**
19. Each class in the novice section is open to any competitor who has not been a prize winner, three times in that class.
